BELEW

Belew unlawfully holds office, DA alleges *Counter filing claims there is lack of evidence of a felony conviction*

A local prosecutor has opened civil litigation against Precinct 1 Commissioner Harley Belew claiming the latter is ineligible to hold public office due to a felony conviction from the 1970s. But Belew's attorney alleges the removal of an elected official requires a technical definition of "conviction" for which evidence hasn't been proffered.

ALLEGATIONS AGAINST BELEW

"Because Defendant has been convicted of a felony offense and

has not been pardoned or otherwise relieved from the resulting disabilities, Defendant is ineligible to hold the public office which he currently occupies," reads a petition filed Monday by the office of 198th District Attorney Stephen Harpold. Belew's attorney, Patrick O'Fiel, on May 2 requesting Belew's resignation. In the letter, Harpold writes that a Texas Rangers investigation determined that on Aug. 13, 1973, Belew was found guilty of burglary and sentenced

CITY Management agreement sets up new public arts program

An agreement between the city of Kerrville and the Kerrville Convention and Visitors Bureau was approved by the city council Tuesday, allowing the bureau to develop and implement a Community Arts Program dedicated to bringing works of art to Kerrville.

"We are excited about the new opportunity," said Julie Davis, president of the Kerrville Convention and Visitors Bureau. "We've been working on plans that will kind of get the ball rolling."

Funding from the city will be \$225,000 per year for the next three years. The funds will allow the new program to commission public art, such as statues, murals or other works, for the beautification of the city, Davis said.

Funding will be transferred no later than Oct. 31 for the first year. That will allow the program to begin collaborating with other art-centered organizations in town, including the Kerr Arts & Cultural Center, Playhouse 2000, the Kerrville Folk





WARM AND HUMID

Thursday starts off with a few clouds and patchy fog. Skies become partly sunny in the afternoon with highs in the upper 80s to near 90 degrees.

South winds average 10 to 15 mph.

With 18 locations and 200 employees, the Mini Mart company is one of the larger employers in the area.

"We have some very loyal, devoted employees,"
